### **Josephine and John Adams**

With great sadness, the Lower North Shore group announces the passing of two of our very important and long-standing John members. and Josephine (Jo) Adams have been members of our group for at least 15 years, and for most of that time. Jo served as the president. She took this role very seriously and spent much time checking on how people in the group were doing, writing letters to them if they were unable to attend or if she was worried about them. She was fully involved in all the social activities of the group.



Jo was ably assisted by her devoted and wonderful husband, John; they provided cakes to celebrate members' birthdays. John would be detailed off to the local cake shop early on Tuesday mornings to buy the all-important "Orange cake". They would then arrive early equipped with plates, serviettes and, most importantly, special candles carefully chosen to accord with the birthday being celebrated. For them, these occasions were very important.

Jo and John also played a very important part in assisting the lower North Short Stroke Group with negotiating our meeting arrangement with the Church at Mosman; John's business acumen certainly came to the fore, and he made sure every detail was covered and our best interests were protected.

Jo celebrated her 90th birthday in 2018 and was still a very active participant in our group until COVID-19 hit. She and John never managed to get back to the group after COVID-19, but she continued to show a keen interest in how the group was going, always asking how everyone was getting along.

John passed away in February 2023 this year and was followed by Jo in August 2023. Their contribution to our group has been enormous. The Lower North Shore group acknowledges their immense contributions and bids farewell to two irreplaceable members. They will be deeply missed.
